JOHN 4

Jesus Talks With a Woman From Samaria

■ Now Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard about him. They had heard that he was gaining and baptizing more disciples than John. ² But in fact Jesus was not baptizing. His disciples were. ³ So Jesus left Judea and went back again to Galilee.

⁴ Jesus had to go through Samaria. ⁵ He came to a town in Samaria called Sychar. It was near the piece of land Jacob had given his son Joseph. ⁶ Jacob's well was there. Jesus was tired from the journey. So he sat down by the well. It was about noon.

DEVOTIONALS

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This devotional and activity reminds us to always search for Jesus, just as the Wise Men searched for him using the star God placed in the sky.



When They Saw The STar, They were filled with joy. The Wise Men went to the house. There They Saw The child with his mother Mary. They bowed down and worshiped him. —Matthew 2:10-11a

A ave you ever wondered about the star the Wise Men followed to find baby Jesus? Scientists think it could have been a comet or a supernova, which is an explosion in the sky that slowly fades from sight over several weeks or months. The star could also have been the planets Jupiter and Venus lining up together to form a bright light in the sky. Whatever it was, God placed the star in the sky to help the Wise Men search for baby Jesus.

What or who has God used in your life to bring you closer to him? Maybe a friend invited you to church. Maybe someone cheered you up when you felt sad. Or maybe you have a parent or grandparent who reads the Bible with you. You might not have a star to follow like the Wise Men, but God places people and things in your life to guide you to him.

Week 46, Day 1 Read About It

God gives us joy no matter how bad things get.

When the school year is almost over, don't you look forward to summer vacation? Maybe you and your family will travel somewhere. Maybe you'll be able to go to the beach or to the pool. You'll be able to hang out with your friends. You know it's going to be great! But until the school year is over you still have homework to finish. And you still have to go to school. All of that can be hard work! But even while you're working hard in school, you know that summer vacation is still coming! That makes the work not so hard.

That's like what the apostle Paul is telling the believers in this letter to the Philippians. He tells them that they might have to do things that are hard. People might be mean to them just because they believe in Jesus. They might even be put in prison just like Paul was. But Paul tells the believers that they can still have joy. They can have joy even while all of those hard things are happening to them! That's because God's promises to them are true. They are his children no matter how bad things get. And you are God's child too when you believe in Jesus. He has wonderful things in store for you in the future! Remembering that can help you during hard times.

Week 39, Day 3 Finding Jesus in Luke

What Luke wanted us to know about Jesus is clear. Jesus is the cure for sin! That's because Jesus was the only human being who wasn't infected by sin. So only Jesus could seek out sin and save people from it. Jesus died to provide the final cure for sin. And his cure is so effective not even death has power over him! And death has no power over those who believe in him either!

When we believe in Jesus, he makes us spiritually healthy again! And Jesus brings his cure for sin into every part of our lives. He brings it to our thoughts, our feelings, and our actions. Anyone who believes in Jesus will receive this cure for their sin. Our relationships with God and with one another can be healthy again. All we have to do is ask Jesus for the cure!

Week 39, Day 6 Do Something About It

Jesus came to seek and to save what was lost! This activity is a treasure hunt that you will design. You will be the guide and give the clues. First you need to make the treasure. Write Luke 19:10 (written below) on a piece of paper. Wrap this paper around your favorite piece of candy or other fun surprise. Decide where you'll hide the treasure. Put it there while no one is looking.

Now make a map for each treasure hunter. The map should have at least five clues to solve before the treasure can be found. The clues should lead the treasure hunters to several places indoors and outdoors. Include at least one place that's hard to get to.

The hunt is over when someone finds the treasure. That person gets to read the verse and keep the treasure. But then celebrate with everybody. The celebration will remind you of the celebration in heaven when someone finds Jesus.

In this activity, you'll create ornaments to hang on your Christmas tree to celebrate Jesus' birth.

CHRISTMAS TREE ORNAMENTS

STUFF YOU NEED:

- Clear glass ornaments (or plastic if you can find some that have removable tops)
- Bottles or tubes of acrylic paint (CAUTION: have children wear old clothes and smocks as this paint will stain)

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Carefully remove the top of the ornament. Pull the top off a little. Then pinch the two wires together to pull the top the rest of the way off.
- 2. Let children pick out their paint colors. Two or three usually work best.
- 3. Let child squeeze paint in the ornament. You can add all of the colors at once because the paint won't mix.
- 4. Have children turn the ornaments being careful not to turn them completely upside down so the paint can spill out. Keep turning until paint covers the entire inside of the ornaments.
- 5. Let the paint dry for an hour or so before putting the top back on the ornaments for your children.

The shepherds were the first to hear the news of Jesus' birth, and they couldn't wait to see their new King and to tell others about him. This fun activity reminds us that we should also be excited to share the news of Jesus.

MARBLE MANGER RELAY

STUFF YOU NEED:

- Six or more people
- Marbles
- Construction paper (one sheet per person)
- Masking tape

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Use the masking tape to mark start and finish lines across the room from each other.
- 2. Split the group into 2 or more groups with each group having at least 3 people.
- 3. Give each player a sheet of construction paper.
- 4. Show how to fold the paper in half lengthwise two times to create a crevice that looks like a manger.
- 5. Remind children that in the Bible story (Luke 2:8-20), the angels brought good news to the shepherds, the shepherds ran off to Bethlehem to see the good news—Jesus in the manger—and then the shepherds told everyone they could find about the good news of a Savior. Your job is to pass the good news (the marble) across the room by rolling it from one manger to another.
- 6. Players stand next to each other, feet touching, and pass the marble from his manger to the next person's manger.
- 7. Once a player passes the marble from his manger to the next person's manger, he or she can run to the head of the line and be ready to receive it, then pass it again.
- 8. If someone loses control of the marble and it falls to the floor, everyone on that team goes back to the start line.
- 9. The first team to make it to the finish line, wins!

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This activity reminds us that Jesus came to earth as both God and a human being so that he could die for our salvation.
